### ***City Council Message***

*from Mayor Steve A. Hiatt*



Welcome to a new year! I can't believe how quickly 2012 came and went, and boy was it a great year! We express our deepest appreciation to each of you who helped make 2012 great, complete with wonderful community events that make us Utah's Hometown.

Many of us rang in the New Year by celebrating at Kaysville's own New Years celebration. The event was a huge success, due in large part to the hard work of community volunteers. The new location at Davis High School kept all of the activities indoors and drew record attendance! Thanks to event Chair's Gary and Gaylene Bullock, Food Chair's Russell and Jennifer Lindberg, our Park and Recreation staff, and the countless other volunteers who helped make the evening a success!

I was recently asked by a friend, "What is the best thing about serving as Mayor?" I responded, "Serving good people who truly want the best for our community and show it through their words, service, actions, and attitude." I am always impressed by so many who show their support to one another by various random acts of kindness.

Kaysville City is continuing our efforts to Go Green! After much success with our curbside recycling program, and based on your feedback, Kaysville City is implementing an optional city-wide curbside Green Waste Recycling Program. Green waste materials, such as lawn clippings, cuttings from bushes and shrubs, leaves and other garden waste are relatively clean, biodegradable, and can be turned into mulch and compost material.

Recycling yard trimmings will improve performance at the Wasatch Integrated Waste Management Energy Recovery Facility (incinerator) and will help extend the life of the landfill.

Participating in our optional Green Waste Recycling Program is good for the environment and, when it replaces your second garbage can, is good for your wallet! The can is picked up weekly and, during the winter months (December 1-March 31), can be used for regular household waste.

The program is set to begin in the middle of March. Those wishing not to participate can notify the City in person, by phone, mail, or email by February 15th. Each of you should have received a postcard outlining the details of the program. You can also review the article in this newsletter for details on how to opt out.

Our regular "Blue Can" recycling program will continue to be picked up every other week. However, if bi-weekly pickup of one can is NOT sufficient for your family, you may request a second blue can by calling City Hall. The cost for a second blue can is \$3.85 a month, the same as the cost for the first can.

Kaysville City is the second largest participating city in the Waste District (comprised of Davis County, excluding Bountiful). By implementing this new Green Waste Recycling Program, Kaysville is the largest city in Davis County to offer all three forms of waste collection--Recyclables, Green Waste, and Garbage. Thanks to each of you for making the commitment to help protect the environment.

On behalf of the Kaysville City Council, we appreciate your support and the opportunity to serve you. We always welcome your feedback and appreciate opportunities to work with each of you to make our community better! May the coming year bring the blessings of peace and happiness to you and your family.

## Spring Cleanup

Spring cleanup begins Monday, April 22, at 6:00 a.m. All material must be loadable by hand without the use of heavy equipment. Please have items bundled together or bagged. Tree branches must be cut in lengths of 5' or less and must be tied together in tight bundles not to exceed 50 lbs. **Tree limbs not tied in bundles will be rejected.** Loose items such as leaves, weeds, grass and shrub trimmings need to be placed in bags or suitable disposable containers. All refuse must weigh less than 50 lbs. Construction material, wood, sheetrock, concrete, sod, soil, rocks, highly volatile material, asbestos, hazardous waste, refrigerators, and lead products are not accepted.



If you would like to dispose of residential waste yourself, items can be taken to the Energy Recovery Facility (650 East Highway 193, Layton), or to the Landfill (1997 East 3500 North, Layton). Disposal of refrigerators must be accompanied with a certificate documenting Freon removal.

Compost and screened wood products (including mulch and wood chips) are available for purchase at the Landfill. Three sizes of ground wood chips are available for \$10 per scoop. Compost is available for \$25 per scoop. Bring your truck or trailer and they will load it for you.

### Dumping Dirt on Streets



City ordinance prohibits dumping dirt, mulch, gravel, etc. on City streets. EPA closely regulates what goes into storm drains. When these types of materials are dumped in the streets, rain or watering of lawns causes it to move into storm drains. Kaysville City could receive huge fines for allowing dirt or debris to be placed on City streets. When you are building a new home, landscaping your yard, replacing a driveway, etc., please be prepared to tell the soil delivery company or contractor where the material can be dumped on your property. Dump trucks should back up to the curb and dump onto your property (which can include the sidewalk area) and not into the street. However, they should not drive onto the curb. The weight of the truck will break the curb. Dumping material on streets is becoming a more widespread problem and, therefore, will be more closely monitored. Citations may be issued to residents, sand and gravel companies, and/or contractors who dump material on City streets.

### Tree Trimming

Trees that have been planted in park strips (the area between the curb and sidewalk) become a safety and nuisance problem when they mature. If you have trees planted in the park strip, please keep them trimmed. Snowplows, dump trucks, garbage trucks, and street sweepers cannot get close to the curb when tree limbs extend into the street. Our trucks need a height clearance of 15' from the back of the curb. Limbs taller than 15' do not need to be trimmed. If you cannot or do not trim your trees, our Public Works Department will trim them for you. If you are particular about your trees, please trim them yourself so that it will be done to your satisfaction.



### House Numbers

Well placed, highly visible identifying house numbers can shorten the response time for emergency vehicles. Numbers placed on curbs are hard to see in the winter because of snow and in the summer because of cars parked against the curb. Ensure that numbers are large enough to be easily read from the opposite side of the street. And make sure to select a style of numbers that are easy to read and discern. It is also a good idea to place the numbers where they can be illuminated at night. In order to protect yourself and your property, place your house numbers where they can easily be seen.

### Parking on Streets



The overnight parking restriction on City streets ends March 1. However, Kaysville City does not allow the parking of trailers, RV's or boats on City streets any time of the year. Parking these types of vehicles on the streets creates many hazards and is unsightly. Please be a courteous neighbor and a responsible citizen and park these vehicles on your own property. Trailers, RV's and boats parked on City streets could be impounded or given a citation.

## *Green Waste Recycling*

Beginning April 1, 2013, Kaysville City will participate in green waste curbside recycling. Green waste recycling is a voluntary program for collection of green yard waste. Green waste material includes lawn cuttings, clippings from bushes or shrubs, leaves, garden waste, produce, and other similar green yard waste. Items not accepted in your green waste container include sod, dirt, rocks, painted, stained and pressure treated lumber, treated wood, plywood, particle board, siding, paper, and plastic. Lawn clippings and other yard waste should not be placed into plastic bags but should be dumped directly into the can. Green waste materials are relatively clean, biodegradable, and unnecessarily take up space in landfills. The materials can be turned into mulch and compost material. Recycling yard trimmings will improve performance at the Wasatch Integrated Waste Management Energy Recovery Facility and will help extend the life of the landfill by as much as 20 years. Fliers were recently sent to residents of Kaysville explaining the program in detail. **If you would like to opt-out of this program, you must return the opt-out portion of the flier or call City Hall at 801-546-1235 by February 15.** Containers will be delivered between March 15-30. Cost for each container is \$6.50 per month. Cans will be picked up each week on the same day as your regular trash can pickup. During winter months (December 1 to March 31), the green waste container may be used for regular household waste. If bi-weekly pickup on your blue can is not sufficient, a second blue can may be ordered by calling City Hall at 801-546-1235.



### *Keep Informed About Meetings and Community Events*

If you want to keep informed about issues being considered by the Planning Commission and City Council, sign up to receive electronic notification of all meetings. Fill in the boxes and you will automatically begin to receive email notification of meetings and community events.

### *Cemetery Holiday Cleanup*

A complete cleanup of all holiday decorations and flowers on gravesites will take place Monday, April 1, at 7:00 a.m.

During the mowing season (April to November), artificial flowers and decorations (balloons, craft items, figurines, flags, pinwheels, potted live plants, shepherd hooks, solar lights, etc.) are not permitted on gravesites and will be removed and discarded (except during holidays). Fresh flowers are permitted if placed in permanent vases that are attached to headstones. Please keep in mind that all flowers and decorations will be removed and discarded the Monday following Memorial Day (June 3).

### *Municipal Election*

Kaysville City announces that a Mayoral position and two Council Member positions will become vacant December 31, 2013. Declaration of candidacy or nomination petitions must be filed in person with the Kaysville City Recorder at 23 East Center Street, Kaysville, from June 1 to June 15, 2013 during regular office hours (8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. weekdays). The General Election will be held on November 5, 2013. Qualifications for candidacy are:

- Be a registered voter of the municipality.
- Be a resident of the municipality or recently annexed area for 12 consecutive months immediately before the date of the election.
- Not be a convicted felon unless the right to hold elective office has been restored.
- Pay a \$100.00 non-refundable filing fee at the time of filing.

### *Animals in Parks*

Dogs and horses are not allowed in City parks (with the exception of the East Mountain Wilderness Park) and are not allowed in the Cemetery. Davis County Animal Control will issue citations to owners of animals within park boundaries. Animals are allowed on perimeter walks around the parks only. Please remember to keep dogs on a leash.



### *Soccer*

Soccer registration will be held April 1 to May 31. Fees are \$44.00 for K-2nd grade and \$54.00 for 3rd-12th grade and include experienced referees (older divisions), training for coaches, uniform (jersey, shorts and socks) and spring and fall season play.
